

# AIM CUAD 2008 ACTIVITY REPORT

**Date:**

Sunday 2nd March 2008

**Site Coordinator:**

Siddiq Buckley, registered the Australian Islamic Mission (AIM) with the official Clean Up Australia Day web site, allowing AIM to receive a CUAD kit including garbage bags, sharps container, gloves, registration forms and other documentation.

**Target Areas:**

Wiley Park reserve, but also included Matthews Street and shrub-planting at the new Council car park at Punchbowl Park in Rose Street with Cr Khoder Saleh from Canterbury City Council and the Punchbowl Tenant Group.

**Registered Volunteers:**

- 29 adults – 18 males and 11 females
- 2 children (under 16)
- Many smaller children also helped their parents.

**Program:**

9am: Volunteers met at the AIM Centre in Punchbowl for morning tea plus a short briefing by the Site Coordinator and talk by Cr Khoder Saleh.

9:30am: Most volunteers went by car to the Wiley Park reserve for Clean Up, with the remainder going to Punchbowl Park in Rose Street to help with the shrub planting. Wiley Park had already been visited by another group earlier that morning, so after collecting about 4 large bags of extra rubbish, some volunteers returned to Matthews Street to collect an additional 3 bags while some of the family groups went to Punchbowl Park.

12:15pm: All returned to the AIM Centre for a delicious Lebanese lunch.

No accidents or incidents were reported and no needles were found.

About 100kg of rubbish was collected and left at the sites for Council to collect.
